



**Remarks of Gregory W. Powell  
Harold Alfond Foundation**

**MaineGeneral Health Dedication of the Alfond Center for Health  
Augusta, Maine  
September 28, 2013**

On behalf of the Harold Alfond Foundation, Peter Alfond, Larry Pugh, Bob Marden and I are delighted to be here this afternoon to celebrate the dedication of this magnificent building.

Just days ago, a MaineGeneral physician perfectly described the feelings we share at this moment. Here is what he said:

*... I walked out of the Center for Cancer Care at about 6 pm, after seeing a new patient there. The encounter had been a good one; we had connected, and I felt I could help her.*

*Out in the parking lot, I was the only one there; all cars were gone now. Across the expanse, the construction site was quiet as well. The new hospital seemed massive, ready, poised and I felt—not that I was 30 years younger—but that I would live forever. All was right in the world.*

This afternoon, as we reflect on the enormity of what we have accomplished and the great promise of our future, all is right in the world.

Some may be wondering what will become of the Foundation's \$2,000,000 year-end bonus. To help us answer that question, could I ask every MaineGeneral employee here this afternoon to please stand.

Harold Alfond loved to say, "don't tell me, show me". With Harold's favorite saying in mind, our Foundation trustees asked Chuck and Scott what should be done with our \$2 million end-of-the-year bonus. Without hesitation, they knew just the right thing.

On behalf of Harold Alfond's foundation, I am pleased to announce that this holiday season, when you have crossed the finish line and our new hospital is up and running, we will show you our thanks and appreciation.

With our \$2,000,000, every member of the MaineGeneral team—every employee in the MaineGeneral system—will receive a holiday bonus of \$500 for full-time employees and \$250 for part-time employees.
